CUSTOMER INFORMATION NOTICE and IMPORTANT CONTRACT NOTES: Our program is designed to provide your lawn with the materials it needs to live up to its potential, but, because results are largely weather driven, patience is required. When the weather is good, lawns tend to look good. When the weather is poor, lawn quality suffers. We can only apply materials, not control results. We may customize your program to meet the needs of your lawn, as a result of weather, material availability and cost. Changes will be noted on your service invoice at the time of service. Because turf and environmental conditions vary, improvement may take **2-3 full growing seasons and is completely dependent on favorable weather**. Patience is necessary. The success of our program is limited to the extend that certain factors, can be managed. These include but are not limited to weather and climate change stressors, soil type, sunlight/shade, exposure, traffic, mowing, slope, acts of nature, pests, previous care, or lack thereof, etc. Lawns should only be watered when needed! Daily or frequent watering promotes fungus and weeds. It also makes shallow roots. Please follow our seasonal care instructions on every invoice.

*Crabgrass, weeds, and insects can only be adequately managed with agreeable weather and if all applications are performed. **Pesticides reduce but do not eliminate pests**. Weeds germinate every day. Other than crabgrass, **weeds are not preventable**. Some weeds must be tolerated by the homeowner. The same is true for all pests such as ticks and fleas. Kyllinga and other hard-to-control weeds require multiple sprayings and may result in brown patches where treated and must be tolerated by the homeowner.

*Partial programs are simply not effective in helping lawns reach their potential. All 6 services are needed each year as they provide consistent nutrition/controls. *Shade is a lawn's enemy. Most turf grasses need at least **4-6 hours of direct sunlight daily**. Even shade varieties need 2-3 hours daily.

*Our fertilizers are slow release and do not burn lawns when applied at any time. Temperatures over 85 degrees, dryness or fungus will cause lawns to brown out and have nothing to do with fertilizer. Lawns should be treated normally while mother nature goes through her normal hot and dry cycles.

*Lawn diseases (fungus) are the norm due to climate change. **Excessive moisture promotes fungus**. Proper watering and cutting are necessary for mitigation. "Be aware that sanitation, as well as physical and biological control measures, should be considered as a part of a good pest control program. Pesticides may be used as another part of a good pest control program. Pesticides are substances used to control living organisms and vary in degree of toxicity." "A copy of the label(s) for the pesticide(s) used will be available, if requested by the contracting party."
